Franklin County Beekeepers Association History

The formal organizational meeting of the Franklin County Beekeepers Association took place on Tuesday, September 11, 1979, at 6:30 pm at the Antrim House in Greencastle. The bylaws for the association were approved at that meeting. The officers were as follows: President -Lewis Johnson, Chambersburg; V. President-Joe Bullock, Greencastle: Sec.-Treas.-Robert Forsythe, Shippensburg; Directors- Lee Golden, Greencastle, Walter Burkholder, Greencastle, and Mel Bland, Chambersburg. The stated purpose for forming the organization at the time was "to conduct educational programs for beekeepers, to work for legislation favorable to the bee industry, and to encourage and promote the bee and honey industry in general."
